

What the Bible says about these Wise Men

Matthew 2:1 ¶ Now when Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judaea in the days of Herod the king, behold, there came wise men from the east to Jerusalem,

2 Saying, Where is he that is born King of the Jews? for we have seen his star in the east, and are come to worship him.


Verse 2 is our outline:

They saw: his star in the east

They did: come to worship him.

Then they had access to all but the post-exile books: Hag, Zech, Esth, Ezra, 1&2Chron, Neh, Mal


(Roughly exiled to Babylon in 600 BC, and gone for exactly 70 years, returning then in 600-70 = 530 BC.
Learn to rightly divide the Word of Truth.)






The wise men account continues:

Matt 2:9 -11 When they had heard the king, they departed; and, lo, the star, which they saw in the east, went before them, till it came and stood over where the young child was. When they saw the star, they rejoiced with exceeding great joy. And when they were come into the house, they saw the young child with Mary his mother, and fell down, and worshipped him: and when they had opened their treasures, they presented unto him gifts; gold, and frankincense, and myrrh.





They knew there was a coming Saviour: Genesis 3:15 And I will put enmity between thee and the woman, and between thy seed and her seed; it shall bruise thy head, and thou shalt bruise his heel.

They knew he would be of the seed of Abraham.

Genesis 12:3 And I will bless them that bless thee, and curse him that curseth thee: and in thee shall all families of the earth be blessed.





They knew he would be of the tribe of Judah (a Jew):
Genesis 49:10 The sceptre shall not depart from Judah, nor
a lawgiver from between his feet, until Shiloh come; and
unto him shall the gathering of the people be.


In Gen.49.10 there is a one time use of the primary root of the Hebrew word Shiloh (07886 שִּׁשִׁילֹה Shiyloh) which brings to bear the more personal meaning "He whose it is, that which belongs to him, tranquility." Otherwise the predominant use of Shiloh (07887 שׁלֹה or שׁלֹה or שׁלֹה shee-lo) in its 32 other scriptures means "a city in Ephraim and temporary home of the Ark of the Covenant and the Tabernacle, the place where Samuel grew up." Ref Strong's Exhaustive Concordance of Scripture. Word studies are good for us.

They knew he would sit on the throne of King David and spring from his seed-line.


2 Samuel 7:16 And thine house and thy kingdom shall be established for ever before thee: thy throne shall be established for ever.











Isaiah 28:16 Therefore thus saith the Lord GOD, Behold, I lay in Zion for a foundation a stone, a tried stone, a precious corner stone, a sure foundation: he that believeth shall not make haste.

They knew he would be a stumbling stone:

Isaiah 8:14 And he shall be for a sanctuary; but for a stone of stumbling and for a rock of offence to both the houses of Israel, for a gin and for a snare to the inhabitants of Jerusalem.








They knew he would be die for the iniquity of the world:

Isa 53:3 He is despised and rejected of men; a man of sorrows, and acquainted with grief: and we hid as it were our faces from him; he was despised, and we esteemed him not.


- 4 ¶ Surely he hath borne our griefs, and carried our sorrows: yet we did esteem him stricken, smitten of God, and afflicted.
- 5 But he was wounded for our transgressions, he was bruised for our iniquities: the chastisement of our peace was upon him; and with his stripes we are healed.
- 6 All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned every one to his own way; and the LORD hath laid on him the iniquity of us all.













Matthew 8:2 And, behold, there came a leper and worshipped him, saying, Lord, if thou wilt, thou canst make me clean.

Matthew 9:18 While he spake these things unto them, behold, there came a certain ruler, and worshipped him, saying, My daughter is even now dead: but come and lay thy hand upon her, and she shall live.

Matthew 14:33 Then they that were in the ship came and worshipped him, saying, Of a truth thou art the Son of God.

Matthew 15:25 **Then came she and worshipped him,** saying, Lord, help me.

Matthew 28:9 And as they went to tell his disciples, behold, Jesus met them, saying, All hail. And they came and held him by the feet, and worshipped him.

Matthew 28:17 And when they saw him, they worshipped him: but some doubted.

Mark 5:6 But when he saw Jesus afar off, he ran and worshipped him,

Luke 24:52 And they worshipped him, and returned to Jerusalem with great joy:

John 9:38 And he said, Lord, I believe. And he worshipped him.

Acts 10:25 And as Peter was coming in, Cornelius met him, and fell down at his feet, and worshipped him. 26 But Peter took him up, saying, Stand up; I myself also am a man.

Paul and Barnabas refused worshiped at Athens... Angels refused man's worship... but the Son of Man, the Second Adam, He is to be worshiped.

Revelation 5:14 And the four beasts said, Amen. And the four and twenty elders fell down and worshipped him that liveth for ever and ever.

The wise men of Matthew chapter two knew some things, saw something, and did some thing. Wise men make a study of "he that is born King of the Jews." These came from the 300 year old ashes of a world empire that once held God's chosen remnant of these Jews. They knew the newborn king would be the only begotten Son of God from Psalms 2; even the founder of the empire knew of that relationship (Daniel 3:25). Their instructor, Daniel, was a profound teacher of God's truths; he still is; he has been for all wise men studying Scripture. They knew this Messiah would arrive 483 years after the Jews were released from bondage (Daniel 9:24-26). They knew he would be the Saviour of the world (Gen 3:15), the seed of Abraham (12:3) occupy the throne of King David (2Sam7:16), be born of a virgin (Isa 7:13-14), and be called "The mighty God, the everlasting Father" (Isa 9:6-7). I would that my neighbor new that much about Messiah because, "Whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have eternal life" (John 3:15). These wise men saw a supernatural star that led them to a house where the child was. Those not believing in the supernatural suppose it was Mercury crossing Venus in 4 BC, or perhaps a supernova, but believers know it was not natural but a supernatural sign from God. We know because, "All scripture is given by inspiration of God" (that is, copies of copies of copies that young Timothy had in 2Tim 3:16). The wise men of Matthew chapter two worshiped the Only Begotten Son of God, who said worship no other God but the LORD God. The Son is indeed "the mighty God, the everlasting Father," and we should worship him too. Merry Christmas.
